The weekend's main event brings the best of Asheville's epicurean scene under one roof. Festivalgoers will get a true taste of the Asheville culinary experience through cooking demonstrations, regional, national, and international wines, cuisine from exceptional local restaurants, craft beer and spirits, an amateur winemaker competition, and samples of small-batch specialty products. This year's WNC Chefs Challenge finale, held during the Grand Tasting, pits the two remaining contestants in an *Iron Chef*-style "food fight" as they compete for the title of Best Chef in WNC.
